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Report on review of interim condensed financial information

To the Unitholders and Fund Manager of Albilad Saudi Sovereign Sukuk ETF

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed statement of financial position of Albilad Saudi Sovereign Sukuk ETF (the "Fund") as of 30 June 2025 and the related interim condensed statements of comprehensive income, changes in net assets attributable to the Unitholders and cash flows for the sixmonth period then ended and explanatory notes. Fund Manager is responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim condensed financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 - "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34"), as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim condensed financial information based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing, as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34, as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

1 LEGAL STATUS AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

Albilad Saudi Sovereign Sukuk ETF (the "Fund") is an open-ended exchange traded investment fund, managed by Albilad Investment Company ("Fund Manager"), a subsidiary of Bank Albilad (the "Bank") for the benefit of the Fund's Unitholders (the "Unitholders"). The objective of the Fund is to seek to simulate the performance of Albilad Ideal Ratings sovereign Sukuk index, which includes Saudi Riyals denominated Sukuk, listed in the Saudi Exchange (Tadawul), with a maturity of 3 months or more.

In dealing with the Unitholders, Fund Manager considers the Fund as an independent accounting unit. Accordingly, Fund Manager prepares separate financial statements for the Fund. Furthermore, the Unitholders are considered to be the beneficial owners of the assets of the Fund.

Riyad Capital is the custodian (the "Custodian") of the Fund.

In August 2019, the Capital Market Authority ("CMA") approved Albilad Investment Company's request to offer and register "Albilad Saudi Sovereign Sukuk ETF" units on Tadawul as Exchange Traded Fund (ETF). The Fund started trading on Tadawul as an ETF on 22 Jumada Al-Thani 1441H (corresponding to 17 February 2020, with the symbol 9403).

The Fund is governed by the Investment Fund Regulations (the "Regulations") issued by the Board of the Capital Market Authority (CMA) pursuant to its Resolution Number 1 - 219 - 2006 on 3 Dhul Hijja 1427H (corresponding to 24 December 2006) and new amendment number 2-22-2021 by resolution of the Board of the CMA on 12 Rajab 1442H (corresponding to 24 February 2021) effective from 19 Ramadan 1442H (corresponding 1 May 2021) by the New Investment Fund Regulations ("Amended Regulations") published by the Capital Market Authority on 17 Rajab 1442H (corresponding to 1 March 2021) detailing requirements for all funds within the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. During the period ended 30 June 2025, CMA has issued another amendment to the regulation via amendment number 1-54-2025 issued on 23 Dhul Qidah 1446H (corresponding to 21 May 2025) which is effective subsequent to the period ended 30 June 2025, from 14 Muharram 1442H (corresponding 9 July 2025).

The registered office of the Fund is Albilad Investment Company, P.O. Box 8162, Riyadh 12313 – 3701, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

1.1 Primary market operation (issuance and redemption of units)

The primary market operations are only carried out by Fund Manager who is the authorized Market Maker Albilad Investment Company. The Issuance and Redemption activities are done on the basis of blocks of exchange traded fund (ETF) units (for the Fund, one block equals 100,000 ETF Units), referred to Issuance and Redemption of Units respectively. The process of issuance and redemption of ETF units is on an in-kind basis whereby the Market Maker interexchange ETF Units of the Fund and the basket of assets (sukuk), through the Custodian, for the purpose of issuance and redemption of ETF units. The issued units are then freely floated on Tadawul for public trading.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

This interim condensed financial information of the Fund have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 – "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34") as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. This interim condensed financial information should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024. In addition, results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025, are not necessarily indicative of the actual results for the full year ending on 31 December 2025 and final results may differ.

The interim condensed financial information has been prepared on a historical cost convention using the accrual basis of accounting, except for the revaluation of investments held at fair value through statement of income (FVSI).

The principal accounting policies, estimates and assumptions used in the preparation of this interim condensed financial information are consistent with those of the previous financial year i.e. for the year ended 31 December 2024 except for note 3 below.

The Fund does not have a clearly identifiable operating cycle and therefore does not present current and noncurrent assets and liabilities separately in the interim condensed statement of financial position. Instead, assets and liabilities are presented in order of liquidity.

The Fund can recover or settle all its assets and liabilities within 12 months from the reporting date.

The preparation of this interim condensed financial information requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected. There are no areas of significant judgment or significant assumption used in the preparation of this interim condensed financial information.

In preparing this interim condensed financial information, the significant judgments made by management in applying the Fund's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty including the risk management policies were the same as those that applied to the annual financial statements as at and for the year ended 31 December 2024.

3 CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICY AND DISCLOSURES

New standards, interpretations and amendments adopted by the Fund

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of this interim condensed financial information are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Fund's annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024, except for the adoption of new standards effective as of 1 January 2025. The Fund has not early adopted any standard, interpretation or amendment that has been issued but is not yet effective. Several amendments apply for the first time in 2025, but do not have a significant impact on this interim condensed financial information of the Fund.

4 FUNCTIONAL AND PRESENTATION CURRENCY

Items included in this interim condensed financial information are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Fund operates (the "functional currency"). This interim condensed financial information are presented in Saudi Riyals ("SR") which is the Fund's functional and presentation currency.

The Fund did not have any foreign currency transactions during the period ended 30 June 2025 (30 June 2024: Nil).

5 RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND BALANCES

Related parties comprise Fund Manager, Directors, Fund Board, key management personnel and any businesses which are controlled, either directly or indirectly, by the Unitholders or over which they exercise significant influence. The Fund enters into transactions in the normal course of business with these parties at prices and terms agreed between the parties.

During the period, the Fund reassessed the definition of related parties per IAS 24 Related Party Disclosures and noted that the relationship with the entity with custody fee was not a related party per IAS 24. As a result, the transactions related to 30 June 2024 have been restated to remove these transactions.

Transactions with related parties

In the ordinary course of its activities, the Fund transacts business with related parties. Related party transactions are in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of the Fund.

For management services, the Fund pays 0.3% (2024: 0.3%) as total expense out of which management fee is paid as remaining item after deducting all other expenses of Fund of the net assets value at each Valuation Day of the Fund's net assets value.

Fund Manager also recovers certain expenses incurred on behalf of the Fund within limits mentioned in the Terms and Conditions of the Fund.

6 FAIR VALUES ESTIMATION

The fair value of financial instruments traded in active markets is based on quoted market prices at the close of trading on the reporting date. Instruments for which no sales were reported on the valuation day are valued at the most recent bid price.

An active market is a market in which transactions for the asset or liability take place with sufficient frequency and volume to provide pricing information on an ongoing basis.

The fair value hierarchy has the following levels:

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the entity can access at the measurement date;
- Level 2 inputs are inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly; and
- Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The estimated fair value of the Fund's financial assets and liabilities is not carried at fair value, is not considered to be significantly different from their carrying values. The fair value of investments held at FVSI are based on quoted prices in active markets and are therefore classified within Level 1.

Level 1 financial instruments comprise of investments in Saudi Government Treasury Bill Sukuks which are fair valued using quoted rate on Tadawul. The fair value of financial instruments not carried at fair value is not significantly different from carrying value as they are short term in nature.

7 FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT

7.1 Financial risk factors

The objective of the Funds is to safeguard the Fund's ability to continue as a going concern so that it can continue to provide optimum returns to its Unitholders and to ensure reasonable safety to the Unitholders.

The Fund's activities expose it to a variety of financial risks: market risk, credit risk and liquidity risk.

Fund Manager is responsible for identifying and controlling risks. The Fund Board supervises Fund Manager and is ultimately responsible for the overall management of the Fund.

Monitoring and controlling risks are primarily set up to be performed based on the limits established by the Fund Board. The Fund has its Terms and Conditions document that set out its overall business strategies, its tolerance of risks and its general risk management philosophy and is obliged to take actions to rebalance the portfolio in line with the investment quidelines.

The Fund uses different methods to measure and manage the various types of risk to which it is exposed; these methods are explained below.

(a) Market risk

The risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market risk comprises three types of risk: foreign exchange risk, commission rate risk and price risk.

The Fund is exposed to market risk due to its investments in sukuk held at FVSI. Fund Manager closely monitors the price movement of its financial instruments in the Market. The Fund's Portfolio Constituents are evaluated according to the latest closing of the Market. Accordingly, the indicative Unit price announced in the Market will reflect the closing price of the Market on the preceding day, which may be different from the Unit trading price. The Fund manages the risk through diversification of its investment portfolio by investing in various industry sectors.

(i) Foreign exchange risk

Foreign exchange risk is the risk that the value of future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate due to changes in foreign exchange rates and arises from financial instruments denominated in foreign currency.

All the Fund's transactions and balances are in Saudi Riyals and therefore the Fund is not exposed to foreign exchange risk.

(ii) Commission rate risk

Commission rate risk is the risk that the value of the future cash flows of a financial instrument or fair values of fixed coupon financial instruments will fluctuate due to changes in market commission rates. Fund has all its investment in fixed rate Saudi Government Sukuks, therefore, Fund is not exposed to commission rate risk.

(iii) Price risk

Price risk is the risk that the value of the Fund's financial instruments will fluctuate as a result of changes in market prices caused by factors other than foreign currency and commission rate movements.

The price risk arises primarily from uncertainty about the future prices of the financial instruments that the Fund holds. Fund Manager closely monitors the price movement of its financial instruments listed at Saudi Exchange. The value of the Fund's investment in sukuk fluctuates because of the change in commission rate and accordingly the Fund is not exposed to price risk.

The effect on the net assets as a result of the change in the fair value of sukuk investments held at FVSI as at 30 June 2025 and 31 December 2024 due to a reasonably possible change in prices of sukuk investments based on the market concentration, with all other variables held constants is as follows:

(b) Credit risk management

Credit risk is the risk that one party to a financial instrument will fail to discharge an obligation and cause the other party to incur a financial loss. The maximum exposure to credit risk amounts to SR 65,122,821 (31 December 2024: SR 76,585,020). It majorly includes investment in Saudi Government Sukuk which have the sovereign rating and is held at fair value. The bank balance held with the Custodian has a sound credit rating and has low credit risk.

Financial assets measured at amortised cost were considered for ECL as at 30 June 2025 and 31 December 2024. However, the impact of ECL on these assets was immaterial as the cash and cash equivalents are held with the Custodian with sound credit rating. There is no history of default for recovery of these balances. Further the sukuks are carried at FVSI.

(c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Fund may not be able to generate sufficient cash resources to settle its obligations in full as they fall due or can only do so on terms that are materially disadvantageous.

The Fund's Terms and Conditions provide for subscription and redemption of units on every Valuation Day and it is, therefore, exposed to the liquidity risk of meeting redemptions at any time. The Fund's securities are considered to be readily realizable and they can be liquidated at any time. However, Fund Manager has established certain liquidity guidelines for the Fund and monitors liquidity requirements on a regular basis to ensure sufficient funds are available to meet any commitments as they arise, either through new subscriptions, liquidation of the investment portfolio or by obtaining financing from the related parties of the Fund. The Fund settles its financial liabilities relating to accrued management fee and other expenses on quarterly basis.

Fund manager monitors liquidity requirements by ensuring that sufficient funds are available to meet any commitments as they arise, either through obtaining loan from related party, or liquidation of its investments.

The Fund manager allows the redemption at the same business day after the request for redemption, if the day is not a business day then redemption will be executed on next business day.

The expected maturity of the assets and liabilities of the Fund is less than 12 months.

(d) Operational risk

Liquidity gap

Operational risk is the risk of direct or indirect loss arising from a variety of causes associated with the processes, technology and infrastructure supporting the Fund's activities either internally or externally at the Fund's service provider and from external factors other than credit, liquidity, currency and market risks such as those arising from the legal and regulatory requirements.

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The Fund's objective is to manage operational risk so as to balance limiting of financial losses and damage to its reputation with achieving its investment objective of generating returns to Unitholders.

7.2 Capital risk management

The capital of the Fund is represented by the net assets attributable to the holders of redeemable units. The amount of net assets attributable to the holders of redeemable units can change significantly on each Valuation Day, as the Fund is subject to subscriptions and redemptions at the discretion of Unitholders on every Valuation Day, as well as changes resulting from the Fund's performance. The Fund's objective when managing capital is to safeguard the Fund's ability to continue as a going concern in order to provide returns for Unitholders, provide benefits for other stakeholders and maintain a strong capital base to support the development of the investment activities of the Fund.

In order to maintain the capital structure, the Fund's policy is to monitor the level of subscriptions and redemptions relative to the assets it expects to be able to liquidate and adjust the amount of dividend distributions the Fund pays to redeemable Unitholders.

The Fund Board and Fund Manager monitor capital on the basis of the value of net assets attributable to the redeemable Unitholders.

Changes in comparatives in the interim condensed financial information

b) Net assets attributable to the Unitholders.

In the prior period, the Fund classified units held by investors as Equity in the interim condensed financial information. This classification has been reassessed in accordance with the puttable instrument guidance in International Accounting Standard 32 – Financial Instruments Presentation "IAS 32").

According to the Terms and Conditions of the Fund, Fund Manager is required to distribute the cash surplus represented by the returns received from the sukuk in the form of monthly distributions to the Unitholders within ten working days after the end of the last working day of the month (the date of distribution). Fund Manager has the right not to distribute cash if no dividends are received from the sukuk. However, Fund Manager has no control over when the returns from the sukuk are received and as such there is no ability to avoid dividend payments.

In accordance with the puttable instrument guidance of IAS 32, if puttable instruments also have the obligation to distribute profits, the entity does not have an unconditional right to avoid delivering cash or another financial asset to settle a contractual obligation, the obligation meets the definition of a financial liability.

The Fund has reassessed the above requirements based on the Terms and Conditions of the Fund and restated the prior period comparatives to present the units held by the Unitholders as a financial liability. As a result, the units are now being presented as "Net Assets attributable to the Unitholders" in the interim condensed statement of changes in equity was removed as the Fund no longer has any equity, and instead, an interim condensed statement of changes in net assets attributable to the Unitholders was provided on page 4 and the interim condensed statements of income and cash flows were amended to refer to "Change in net assets attributable to Unitholders".

10 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS BY CATEGORY

All financial assets and financial liabilities as at 30 June 2025 and 31 December 2024 are classified under amortized cost category except for investments held at FVSI which are classified as and measured at fair value.

11 SEGMENT REPORTING

The Fund carries a portfolio of listed government sukuks instruments on Saudi Stock Exchange. Fund Manager periodically assesses the performance and allocates resources to the business as one unit and, as such, no separate operating segments were identified for financial reporting purposes. Consequently, segment reporting as required by IFRS 8 'Operating Segments' has not been disclosed.
