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Independent Auditor's Review Report On the Interim Condensed Consolidated Financial Statements

To the Shareholders of Al Majed for Oud Company Saudi Joint Stock Company Riyadh - Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed consolidated statement of financial position of Al Majed for Oud Company - Saudi Joint Stock Company "the Company" and its subsidiary (together "the Group") as of 30 September 2025 and the interim condensed consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the three-month and nine-month periods then ended, and the interim condensed consolidated statements of changes in equity and cash flows for the nine-month period then ended, and other explanatory notes. Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim condensed consolidated financial statements in accordance with International Accounting Standard — "Interim Financial Reporting" (IAS 34) that is endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim condensed consolidated financial statements based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (2410), "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" that is endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. A review of interim condensed consolidated financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing that are endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed consolidated financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34 that is endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

1. INFORMATION ABOUT THE COMPANYAND LEGAL STRUCTURE

Al Majed for Oud Company ("the Company"), is a Saudi Joint Stock Company registered in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia under commercial registration number (1010045397) dated 15 Ramadan 1402 (H), corresponding to 7 July 1982 (G).

The registered office is located at 4299 King Abdulaziz Road, As Sahafah Dist., Riyadh 11612, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

On 29 Shaaban 1444 (H), corresponding to 21 March 2023 (G), the partners have unanimously resolved to convert the Company from a Limited Liability Company to a Saudi joint stock Company. This resolution has been indicated in the Commercial Register on 27 Ramadan 1444 (H), corresponding to 18 April 2023(G).

On 26 Dhul-Qi'dah 1445 (H), (corresponding to June 3, 2024(G), the Board of the Capital Market Authority approved the company's request to register its shares and proceed with a public offering of 7,500,000 shares, representing 30% of the total shares of the company.

The Group activities include wholesale and retail outlets, musk, incense, saffron, oriental and western perfumes, cosmetics, bags, glasses, antiques, gifts, and decorative flowers. The Company is also involved in manufacturing room fragrances, air fresheners, men's and women's perfumes, oud oil, oud, incense, mixing and packaging of perfumes and oils, and plants.

The Company holds investments in the following subsidiary, which are included in these interim condensed consolidated financial statements:

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements include the Group's branches in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, State of Kuwait, the United Arab Emirates, Kingdom of Bahrain and Sultanate of Oman.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Basis of compliance

These interim condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard No. (34) "Interim Financial Reporting" as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and other standards and pronouncements approved by the Saudi organization (SOCPA).

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual consolidated financial statements and should therefore be read in conjunction with the Group's consolidated financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The accounting policy adopted in preparing these interim condensed consolidated financial statements are consistent with those followed in preparing the annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the significant judgments made by management in applying the Group's main sources of estimation uncertainty are similar to those described in the annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Results for the Nine-month period ended September 30, 2025, are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the year ending December 31, 2025.

2.2 Basis of measurement

These interim condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for the recognition of employees' end of service benefits at the present value of future obligations on an actuarial basis using the projected unit credit method.

2.3 Functional and presentation currency

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements are presented in Saudi Riyals (兆), which is the Company's functional currency. The financial statements presented are rounded to the nearest (兆), unless otherwise stated.

3. MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are the significant accounting policies applied by the Group in the preparation of the interim condensed financial statements. These policies have been applied consistently to the periods presented, unless otherwise stated.

1.1 Basis of consolidation

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary as at 30 September 2025.

Control is achieved when the Group is exposed, or has rights, to variable returns from its involvement with the investee and has the ability to affect those returns through its power over the investee. Specifically, the Group controls an investee if, and only if, the Group has the following:

- Power over the investee (i.e., existing rights that give it the current ability to direct the relevant activities of the investee).
- Exposure, or rights, to variable returns from its involvement with the investee.
- The ability to use its power over the investee to affect its returns.

Generally, there is a presumption that a majority of voting rights results in control. To support this presumption and when the Group has less than a majority of the voting or similar rights of an investee, the Group considers all relevant facts and circumstances in assessing whether it has power over an investee, including:

- The contractual arrangement(s) with the other vote holders of the investee
- Rights arising from other contractual arrangements
- The Group's voting rights and potential voting rights

The Group re-assesses whether or not it controls an investee, if facts and circumstances indicate that there are changes to one or more of the three elements of control. Consolidation of a subsidiary begins when the Group obtains control over the subsidiary and ceases when the Group loses control of the subsidiary. Assets, liabilities, income and expenses of a subsidiary acquired or disposed of during the period are included in the consolidated financial statements from the date the Group gains control until the date the Group ceases to control the subsidiary.

Profit or loss and each component of other comprehensive income (OCI) are attributed to the equity holders of the parent and to the non-controlling interests, even if this results in the non-controlling interests having a deficit balance.

When necessary, adjustments are made to the financial statements of subsidiaries to bring their accounting policies in line with the Group's accounting policies. All intra-group assets and liabilities, equity, income, expenses and cash flow relating to transactions between members of the Group are eliminated in full consolidation.

A change in the ownership interest of a subsidiary, without a loss of control, is accounted for as an equity transaction. When a Group loses control over a subsidiary, it derecognizes the assets and liabilities of the subsidiary, and any related non-controlling interest and other components of equity. Any resulting gain or loss is recognized in the consolidated statement of comprehensive income. Any interest retained in the former subsidiary is measured at fair value when control is lost.

1.2 New standards, interpretations and amendments

There are new standards and number of amendments to standards which are effective from 1 January 2025 and have been explained in the Group's annual consolidated financial statements, but they do not have a material effect on the Group's interim condensed consolidated financial statements.

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING JUDGMENTS, ESTIMATES AND ASSUMPTIONS

The preparation of the interim condensed consolidated financial statements in conformity with IFRS as endorsed in KSA requires the use of estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the reporting date and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period.

Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. The Group makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates, by definition, may differ from the related actual results.

5. PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, the Group added property, plant, and equipment at a total cost of \pm 25,638,932 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: \pm 31,879,840).

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, the Group disposed of property, plant, and equipment at a net book value of \pm 125,227 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: \pm 677,653). These disposals resulted in capital losses of \pm 77,303 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: \pm 672,985)

During the nine-months ended September 30,2025, the Group transferred a portion of its property, plant and equipment to investment properties with a net book value of \pm 1,467,366 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: \pm zero).

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, the depreciation expense amounted to #25,282,967 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: #24,938,779).

6. LEASES

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, the net additions to right-of-use assets and lease liabilities amounted to \pm 55,497,768 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: \pm 74,666,061).

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, the Group has disposed of right-of-use assets and lease liabilities with net book values of \pm 981,956 and \pm 1,154,294 respectively (For the ninemonths ended September 30, 2024: \pm 14,828,142 and \pm 14,521,535 respectively).

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, the Group modified leases due to changes in the terms and payment schedules of existing lease agreements, resulting in corresponding modifications to the right-of-use assets and lease liabilities amounting to $\pm 2,209,332$.

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, amortization expense and finance costs amounted to \pm 73,031,941 and \pm 10,572,458 respectively (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: \pm 63,200,284 and \pm 9,209,838 respectively).

During the nine-months ended September 30, 2025, lease liabilities Paid amounted to # 82,628,706 (For the nine-months ended September 30, 2024: # 70,420,064).

7. INVESTMENT PROPERTIES

On July 1, 2025, management approved a decision to reclassify a portion of the warehouse located in Jeddah from property used in operations to investment properties, due to a change in its intended use to being held for the purpose of earning rental income. The asset was transferred at the carrying amount of the leased portion, as disclosed in Note (5) - Property, Plant, and Equipment.

During the nine-months ended September 30,2025 depreciation expense amounted to # 4,918 (during the nine months ended September 30, 2024: # zero)

The leased portion of the land and warehouse classified as investment properties was valued to determine their fair value, which amounted to SAR 1.58 million as of September 30, 2025.

The valuation was conducted by an external appraiser accredited by the Saudi Authority for Accredited Valuers (Tageem). Appraiser name: Valie, License No. 11000191.

The fair value was determined based on valuation approaches applied in accordance with IFRS 13 (including the market comparison approach, income approach, residual value approach, and discounted cash flow method).

20. DIVIDENDS

On May 5, 2025, the Ordinary General Assembly approved the Board of Directors' recommendation to distribute cash dividends to shareholders, representing a portion of the company's 2024 annual profits and retained earnings, totaling # 100 million at # 4 per share, paid in full during the period.

On 20 Dhu al-Qi'dah 1445, May 28, 2024, the company's Board of Directors approved the distribution of cash dividends to shareholders, representing a portion of the company's 2023 annual profits and retained earnings, totaling \pm 125 million at \pm 5 per share, paid in full during the period.

On July 28, 2024, a resolution was issued by the board of directors to cancel the approved dividends at the meeting held on December 28, 2023 amounting to \pm 50,000,000, which were paid to shareholders on April 1, 2024. Shareholders' approval was obtained to repay these amounts and the collection of \pm 50,000,000 was completed on 28 July 2024.

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22. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS
