

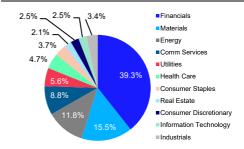

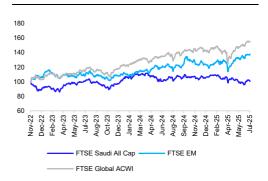

FTSE Semi-annual Review – Sept. 2025 Several potential inclusions, mainly Makkah-based realtors

- This report analyses potential changes in the FTSE Saudi Arabia All Cap Index, which
 includes large, mid, and small cap companies, excluding micro caps.
- FTSE is scheduled to announce the indicative results of its semi-annual review for Sept. 2025 on 22nd August 2025, with changes effective from 22nd Sept. 2025.
- In the previous review, FTSE added Almoosa as a small-cap constituent to the index.
- Potential inclusion candidates: Masar, Jabal Omar, MCDC, Taiba, Jahez, and Rasan
- Flynas meets inclusion criteria comfortably, while SMC needs to rally at least 10%, but both having listed recently will be considered only in the Dec'25 review.
- Bupa's gross market cap is near the lower bound of large caps' threshold facing potential threat of downgrade.
- Based on June's investable market cap. cut off, SAPTCO is slightly exceeding the requirement. However, if the cut-off itself is increased by 5%-10%, then SAPTCO is at the risk of exclusion from the FTSE Saudi Arabia All Cap Index.

Potential inclusion candidates (Sept'25): Considering the closing prices as of 30th June 2025 and the investable market cap cut-off as per the last review (June 2025), we present our analysis for potential inclusion candidates. In our view, several names meet the inclusion criteria comfortably. These include Makkah-based real estate developers — Masar, Jabal Omar, MCDC, and Taiba. Moreover, Jahez is another potential candidate, that was migrated to TASI recently and has witnessed better liquidity. Rasan also meets both the minimum trading requirement as well as market cap. condition. Factoring in the the gross market cap level, Masar is likely to be included as a large-cap; Jabal Omar, MCDC and Taiba as mid-cap, while Rasan and Jahez could fall in the bucket of small cap.

Potential candidates for next review (Dec'25): Flynas meets the necessary investable market cap. criteria comfortably, while SMC is slightly below the cut-off. SMC will have to rally at least 10% from the current levels for it to breach the threshold. However, both were listed recently and have not completed the mandatory three-month trading period yet, thus they will likely be considered only in the next quarterly review (Dec'25). As per FTSE methodology, IPOs must complete at least three months of trading before becoming eligible for inclusion.

Current weights of FTSE Saudi Arabia All Cap Index: The FTSE Saudi Arabia All Cap Index currently comprises of 100 constituents with Al Rajhi (14.1%) and Saudi Aramco (11.1%) being the largest constituents as of 15th July 2025.
