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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT ON THE INTERIM CONDENSED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO THE UNITHOLDERS OF ANB CAPITAL PURE SAUDI EQUITY FUND (SHARIAH) (MANAGED BY ANB CAPITAL COMPANY)

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed statement of financial position of anb capital Pure Saudi Equity Fund (the "Fund") managed by anb capital Company (the "Fund Manager") as at 30 June 2025, and the related interim condensed statement of comprehensive income, interim condensed statement of changes in equity attributable to the unitholders and interim condensed statement of cash flows for the sixmonth period then ended, and explanatory notes. The Fund Manager is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim condensed financial statements in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34, "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34") as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim financial statements based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing that are endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34 as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

For the six-month period ended 30 June 2025

1. GENERAL

anb capital Pure Saudi Equity Fund (Shariah) (the "Fund") is open-ended fund. The investment object of the Fund is to achieve long-term growth of capital through investments in a broadly diversified portfolio of pure Shariah compliant Saudi Arabian equity securities including Murabaha transactions. The Fund was established on 21 Sha'aban 1426H (corresponding to 25 October 2005) by Arab National Bank (the "Bank") which is now managed by anb capital company (the "Fund Manager"). The address of the registered office of the Fund Manager is anb capital company Building, King Faisal Road, Murabba district, Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

In accordance with the Capital Market Authority's (CMA) decision No. 1-83-2005 dated 21 Jumada Awal 1426H (corresponding to 28 June 2005) issued by the CMA Board in connection with the regulations relating to Authorised Persons, the Bank has transferred its asset management operations to ANB capital company ("the Fund Manager"), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Bank, effective 1 January 2008.

The Fund has appointed AlBilad Investment Company (the "Custodian") to act as its custodian and registrar. The fees of the custodian and registrar's services are paid by the Fund.

The Fund Manager is responsible for the overall management of the Fund's activities. The Fund Manager can also enter into arrangements with other institutions for the provision of investment, custody or other administrative services on behalf of the Fund.

2. REGULATING AUTHORITY

The Fund is governed by the Investment Funds Regulations (the "Regulations"), issued by the Board of the Capital Market Authority (CMA) pursuant to Resolution No. 1-219-2006 dated 3 Dhul Hijjah 1427H (corresponding to 24 December 2006G), based on the Capital Market Law issued by Royal Decree No. M/30 dated 2 Jumada Al-Thani 1424H, and as amended by Resolution of the Board of the CMA No. 1-54-2025 dated 23 Dhul-Qi'dah 1446H (corresponding to 21 May 2025G), detailing requirements for investment funds within the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

3. BASIS OF PREPARATION AND CHANGES TO ACCOUNTING POLICIES

3.1. Basis of preparation

These interim condensed financial statements for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34") as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

The interim condensed financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in annual financial statements and should, therefore, be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024. In addition, results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2025 are not necessarily indicative of the results that may be expected for the financial year ending 31 December 2025.

These interim condensed financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for financial assets held at fair value through profit or loss which are stated at their fair value.

These interim condensed financial statements are presented in Saudi Riyals (""), which is the functional currency of the Fund.

3.2 New standards and amendments to standards

3.2.1 New standards and amendments adopted by the Fund

The material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the interim condensed financial statements are consistent with those followed in the Fund's annual financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2024, except for the adoption of new standards effective as of 1 January 2025. The Fund has not early adopted any standard, interpretation or amendment that has been issued but is not yet effective.

6. TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

Related parties are considered to be related if one party has the ability to control the other party or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial or operational decisions. In considering each possible related party relationship, attention is directed to the substance of the relationship, not merely the legal form.

Related parties of the Fund comprise and capital (being the Fund Manager, the Fund Board and administrator of the Fund), mutual funds managed by the Fund Manager and The Arab National Bank ("ANB") (being significant shareholder of the Fund Manager).

The Fund pays a management fee at the rate of 1.75% per annum calculated based on the total net asset value at each valuation date. In addition, the Fund Manager also charges a fee at a maximum rate of 1% per annum calculated based on the total net asset value at each valuation date to meet other expenses of the Fund. A subscription fee of 2% may be charged to the subscribers by the Fund Manager upon subscription.

The management fees amounting to \$\frac{1}{2}\$,2073,702 (30 June 2024: \$\frac{1}{2}\$,2015,663) and other fees amounting to \$\frac{1}{2}\$ 162,452 (30 June 2024: \$\frac{1}{2}\$ 457,506) which have been reflected in the interim condensed statement of comprehensive income and represent the fees charged by the Fund Manager as described above. During the period, the fund recorded BOD remuneration expense of \$\frac{1}{2}\$,2,131 and as at 30 June 2025 a payable of \$\frac{1}{2}\$,2,131 members (30 June 2024: \$\frac{1}{2}\$ nil and payable as at 31 December 2024: \$\frac{1}{2}\$ nil).

The management fees payable and other fees payable to the Fund Manager at the period-end are disclosed in the interim condensed statement of financial position.

7. FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Fund measures its investments in financial instruments at fair value at each reporting date.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either in the principal market for the asset or liability, or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability. The principal or the most advantageous market must be accessible by the Fund. The fair value of an asset or a liability is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming that market participants act in their economic best interest.

The fair value for financial instruments traded in active markets at the reporting date is based on their closing price on the reporting date.

The Fund has only investments at fair value through profit or loss which is measured at fair values and are classified within level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. All other financial assets and liabilities are classified as amortised cost. There were no transfers between various levels of fair value hierarchy during the current year or prior year.
