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Independent Auditor's Review Report on the Interim condensed consolidated financial statements

To the shareholders of Saudi Vitrified Clay Pipe Company

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed consolidated statement of financial position of Saudi Vitrified Clay Pipe Company (the "Company") (and its subsidiaries together "the Group") as of September 30, 2025 and the interim condensed consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the three and nine-month periods then ended, and the interim condensed consolidated statements of changes in equity and cash flows for the nine-month period then ended, and other explanatory notes (the "interim condensed consolidated financial statements"). Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim condensed consolidated financial statements in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 - "Interim Financial Reporting" ("IAS 34") that is endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim condensed consolidated financial statements based on our review.

Scope of review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity", that is endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing that are endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed consolidated financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with IAS 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" that is endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

Material Uncertainty Related to Going Concern

We draw attention to note (4) to the interim condensed consolidated financial statements, which indicates that the Group incurred a net loss of SAR 9.5 million for the nine-month period ending September 30, 2025, and that the accumulated losses as at that date amounted to SAR 57 million, representing 38% of the share capital. Furthermore, the Group reported negative operating cash flows of SAR 15 million for the nine-month period ending September 30, 2025. As the Group continues to incur Josses, these conditions, along with other matters as set out in note (4), indicate that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the Group's ability to continue as a going concern. Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter.

1. SUMMARY OF THE PARENT COMPANY, ITS SUBSIDIARY, AND ITS ACTIVITIES

A- Incorporation

Saudi Vitrified Clay Pipe Company ("Company") is a Saudi joint stock company registered in Saudi Arabia under the Commercial Register No. 1010014993 issued in Riyadh on Rabia AlAwwal 8, 1398 AH (corresponding to February 16, 1978). On 7 August 2024, Saudi Vitrified Clay Pipe Co. announced the Board of Directors' recommendation to increase the share capital by SAR 80 million through a rights issue. As of the date of these interim condensed consolidated financial statements, the Company is still in the process of completing the regulatory procedures.

B- Main activity of the parent company

Manufacturing commercial and plastic pipes, their accessories, and fittings, in various diameters, and providing all supporting works for this purpose.

- Wholesale and retail trade of sanitary equipment, machinery, and tools.
- Public utility connection works and execution of water and sewage projects (water desalination and purification, and wastewater treatment), electrical and mechanical works, and contracting of cooling and air-conditioning works.
- Commercial agency activities related to the Company's purposes after registration in the Commercial Agencies Register.
- Establishing and managing various industrial projects related to pipes and marketing their products and technologies.
- Expanding and developing water management projects and organizing sewage networks.
- Manufacturing several types of pipes used for liquid transportation.
- Manufacturing of all types of molds for concrete surfaces and their derivatives.
- Manufacturing all types of ready-mix concrete.
- Manufacturing water and sewage pipes and accessories.
- Mining and quarrying.

2. BASIS OF PREPARING INTERIM CONDENSED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

2-1 Statement of compliance

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34 "Interim Financial Reporting", as endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and in accordance with other standards and pronouncements issued by the Saudi Organization for Chartered and Professional Accountants (SOCPA).

These interim condensed consolidated financial statements should be read in conjunction with the latest annual consolidated financial statements of the Group for the year ended December 31, 2024.

These interim condensed consolidated financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required for a full set of consolidated financial statements prepared in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS). However, selected accounting policies and explanatory notes have been included to explain significant events and transactions that are relevant to understanding the changes in the Group's financial position and financial performance since December 31, 2024.

2-2 Basis of measurement

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for defined benefit employee plan obligations, which are measured using the Projected Unit Credit Method.

Other bases of measurement are used if required by the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and by other standards and pronouncements issued to complement the IFRS by the Saudi Organization for Chartered and Professional Accountants (SOCPA).

2-3 Presentation and disclosure currency

The interim condensed consolidated financial statements are presented in Saudi Riyals (SAR), which represents the functional currency, and amounts have been rounded to the nearest Saudi Riyal.

2-4 Concern and accumulated losses

The preparation of these interim condensed consolidated financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) endorsed in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia requires management to make judgments, estimates, and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, as well as the disclosures of certain contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the consolidated statement of financial position. Estimates and assumptions also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses. Although these estimates are based on the best information available to management regarding current events and circumstances, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Judgments, estimates, and assumptions are continuously reviewed, and any adjustments to estimates are recognized prospectively.

The significant judgments, assumptions, and estimates made by management in applying the Group's accounting policies, as well as the key sources of uncertainty in these judgments and estimates, were consistent with those disclosed in the Group's most recent annual financial statements.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies applied in these interim condensed consolidated financial statements are the same as those applied in the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024, as no new standards have been issued. However, a number of amendments to standards became effective as of January 1, 2025, which were explained in the Company's annual financial statements, but they do not have a material impact on the Group's interim condensed consolidated financial statements.

New Standards, Amendments to Standards, and Interpretations

New standards and a set of amendments to existing standards became effective as of January 1, 2025, and were disclosed in the Group's consolidated annual financial statements; however, they do not have a material effect on the Group's interim condensed consolidated financial statements.

4. GOING CONCERN AND ACCUMULATED LOSSES

The Group incurred a net loss of SAR 9.5 million for the period ended September 30, 2025, and the accumulated losses of the Group as of September 30, 2025, amounted to SAR 57 million. Furthermore, the Group recorded negative cash flows from operating activities of SAR 15 million for the nine-month period ended September 30, 2025.

The Group's management has assessed the financial performance and working capital for the upcoming period and expects an improvement in clay pipe sales in the coming years compared to 2024, due to the increase in the number of projects offered in 2024 — with clay pipe specifications — by the National Water Company and the National Housing Company compared to 2023, which is expected to positively impact sales in the coming years. Management is confident that it has the necessary resources to continue its operations on a going concern basis and will be able to generate sufficient cash flows to meet its obligations as they fall due over the next twelve months from the date of these interim condensed consolidated financial statements.

Diversification across industries to increase Group sales by also focusing on plastic and cement pipe industries, with the completion of the high-density polyethylene (HDPE) pipe plant expected in the last quarter of 2025.

Expansion and activation of clay pipe sales through exports and projects within the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

The Group has obtained a SAR 20 million loan to finance construction operations to support diversification in industries and increase sales.

The Group is also working on capital increase through the issuance of priority shares, expected to be completed by the end of 2025, which will inject approximately SAR 80 million into the Group's treasury, enabling expansion across all activities.

Furthermore, management has confirmed that it is not aware of any other significant uncertainties that may cast doubt on the Group's ability to continue as a going concern. Accordingly, these interim condensed consolidated financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

5. INTERIM CONDENSED CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL RESULTS FOR THE PERIOD

The Group's management has prepared all necessary adjustments deemed important to present the interim condensed consolidated financial statements fairly as of September 30, 2025, and to reflect the Group's preliminary consolidated results for the period ended on that date.

The interim condensed consolidated financial results for this period may not be indicative of the Group's financial results for the year ending December 31, 2025.

7. CAPITAL WORK IN PROGRESS

Capital work in Progress represents the cost of constructing the "Lafan Pipes Factory", specialized in the production of plastic pipes, which commenced during 2024. The project is being executed according to the planned schedule, and its completion is expected in the last quarter of 2025, after which the costs will be transferred to Property, Plant, and Equipment upon completion and commencement of operations. The balance also includes SAR 1,254,850 related to the construction of new concrete foundations for machinery and equipment of Saudi Land Factory for Cement products, and capitalized interest on projects under construction to date amounted to SAR 808,370.

^{**} During the third quarter of 2025, the Saudi Vitrified Clay Pipe Company entered into a sale agreement for the second factory located in the Second Industrial City in Riyadh and the assignment of the lease contract for the land on which the factory is built, for a total consideration of SAR 45,000,000, excluding any taxes or fees. The payment of the transaction was agreed to be made in two installments: The first installment of SAR 9,000,000 was received upon signing the agreement. The second installment of SAR 36,000,000, along with Value Added Tax (VAT) of SAR 6,750,000, was received in the subsequent period (note 9), after obtaining approval from the Saudi Authority for Industrial Cities and Technology Zones (MODON) for the lease assignment to the buyer and completing the relevant legal procedures. The land under the agreement and the assets on it were delivered to the buyer during the third quarter. The net book value of the assets sold amounted to SAR 23,219,826, resulting in a gain of SAR 21,780,174, which was recognized under Other Income (note 18).

12. LONG-TERM LOAN

- * During the year 2019, Saudi Land Factory for Cement products (the "Subsidiary") entered into a long-term interest-free loan agreement with the Saudi Industrial Development Fund (SIDF) for the purpose of establishing a plant to manufacture reinforced concrete pipes and lined and unlined concrete pipes. The plant is to be constructed on a leased land obtained from the Saudi Authority for Industrial Cities and Technology Zones ("MODON") under a lease contract in Al-Kharj city. The loan qualifies as a government grant, as the SIDF is a governmental entity and the loan was obtained interest-free, and the related conditions of the government grant have been fulfilled. The total financing obtained amounted to SAR 15.9 million. The loan is secured by financial covenants and commitments, as well as by a promissory note covering the full loan amount and a mortgage over all the subsidiary's assets (including buildings, machinery, vehicles, furniture, office equipment, all subsequent expansions, and all appurtenances of the factory). As of September 30, 2025, the subsidiary was not in compliance with these covenants; accordingly, the entire loan balance has been reclassified as a current liability. During the second quarter of 2024, the Group repaid an amount of SAR 3.1 million, reducing the loan balance to SAR 12.8 million as of December 31, 2024. The loan is repayable in semi-annual installments, with the final installment due on 15 Safar 1450H (corresponding to August 8, 2028). The Group's management is currently negotiating with the SIDF to reschedule the loan obligations, as the unpaid installments amounted to SAR 3.4 million as of September 30, 2025.
- ** During the year 2025, the Parent Company obtained long-term banking facilities from the Saudi Investment Bank amounting to SAR 20 million to finance and construct the LAFAN Pipes Factory. The loan is repayable in semi-annual installments from the date of withdrawal, with a total term of 72 months, including a 12-month grace period. The facility is secured by financial covenants and commitments, as well as by a promissory note covering the full facility amount. As of September 30, 2025, the Group was not in compliance with these covenants.

14. SHORT-TERM LOAN

The Group has banking facilities in the form of Murabaha financing arrangements from local commercial banks amounting to a total of SAR 8.62 million as at September 30, 2025, (December 31, 2024: SAR 5 million). These facilities were obtained to finance the Group's operating activities and the construction of the factory for pipe manufacturing. The facilities bear financing costs at prevailing market commission rates, based on SIBOR, plus a fixed margin. The facility is secured by compliance with certain financial covenants and undertakings, in addition to a promissory note covering the full facility amount. The Group was not in compliance with these covenants as at September 30, 2025.

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15. TRADE PAYABLES

The balance as of September 30, 2025, includes an amount of SAR 1,235,033 received by the Group from Al-Dohah Concrete Molds Factory Company for the purpose of entering into a future strategic partnership, represented by a partial acquisition of Saudi Earth Factory for Cement Products Company. The amount has been included under "Trade and other payables – third parties" until the completion of the regulatory procedures and the signing of the final agreements.

16. ZAKAT STATUS

A- Saudi Vitrified Clay Pipe Company (Parent company):

- The Company submitted zakat returns and financial statements to the Zakat, Tax and Customs Authority ("the Authority") until 2024G, and paid the dues according to those declarations and obtained the required Zakat certificates.
- The Company has finalized its status for the years 2017, 2019, 2020 and 2023.
- No zakat assessments were received for the year 2018.
- The Company has received provisional Zakat assessments from the ZATCA for the years 2021 and 2022, and it has

23. PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENTS

- In accordance with the requirements of International Accounting Standard (IAS) 8, Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, management has adjusted the comparative figures for prior periods. The following note details the adjustments, reclassifications, and their impact on items in the consolidated statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income. Accordingly, the opening balances of equity for the earliest period presented have been restated as follows:
- During the current period, the Group reviewed its accounting policies and procedures applied for the allocation of
 impairment losses on property, plant, and equipment. It was identified that a prior period error existed, whereby the
 impairment provision was allocated disproportionately to the affected items, resulting in an overstatement of
 depreciation expense in those periods. The effect of the adjustment for the period ended September 30, 2024, amounted
 to SAR 2,927,218 and was deducted from cost of sales.
- Adjustments were made to the recognition of right-of-use assets, lease liabilities, and related items for certain lease contracts in the prior period. This resulted in adjustments to depreciation of right-of-use assets and finance costs on lease liabilities, including SAR 163,191 of depreciation expense charged to cost of sales and SAR 63,011 of finance costs charged to finance expenses for the period ended September 30, 2024.
- During the current period, the Group also restated certain comparative figures as a result of the transition of a subsidiary from the IFRS for SMEs to full IFRS. This transition led to changes in the subsidiary's accounting policies, which resulted in: recognition of depreciation on right-of-use assets amounting to SAR 157,073 charged to cost of sales; recognition of finance costs on lease liabilities amounting to SAR 70,932; amortization of the fund loan amounting to SAR 318,592 charged to finance costs; restatement of deferred government grant interest of SAR 59,086; and adjustments to other expense related to the transition.
